



Assessment of food handling practices of street food vendors of Delhi NCR

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Abstract

An aggregate of 100 street vendors from region of Delhi, Faridabad, Gurugram and Noida were screened utilizing a bilingual close finished Questionnaire. Results got from the study demonstrated that 57% merchants knew about the general idea of food hygiene, though just 25% were wearing gloves while dealing with the food items, 17% of vendors used to peruse food labels and significant worry of 66% vendors while purchasing items was cost. The outcomes inferred that the street vendors knew about the idea of food hygiene yet need practice because of inaccessibility of resources and infrastructure.

The information recorded represented to that 25% have caught wind of FSSAI and 57% vendors knew about the idea and significance of food safety. 25% vendors were wearing gloves while doing any food handling with methodology though 75% were washing their hands before taking care of food handling though just 25% were utilizing cleanser for washing their hands. 59% vendors purchase item from discount market or dealers.

The significant concern of 66% vendors while purchasing any ingredient or item was cost, 24% vendors purchase item effectively accessible to them and just 10% vendors were concerned about the brand. 17% vendors' wanted to peruse food labels and that excessively significantly manufacturing, expiry date. 66% vendors were using faucet water while 33% merchants use to purchase locally accessible bottles gave them at moderate rates to do exercises like washing hands, vegetables, preparing food and so on.

Conclusion

The aftereffects of the study presumed that the vendors know about the fundamental idea and significance of food hygiene, safety yet need of practice might be absent because of absence of infrastructure and stability.

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
